- 1. The Summit of Heads of State and Government of the Authority, hereinafter referred to as « the Summit» is the Supreme orientation and decision-making Organ..
- 2. The Summit is composed of Heads of State and Government or their duly accredited representatives.
- 3. The Summit defines the general orientation of the development policy of the Authority and controls the latter's executive functions with a view to attaining its objectives.
- 4. It meets once every two years in Ordinary Session in the Member State assuming the chairmanship. Quorum is formed by simple majority.
- 5 The Summit may meet in extraordinary session at the request of the current chairman or a member State.
- 6. The decisions and directives of the Summit are binding on all the institutions of the Authority.
- 7. The Summit gives final ruling on any issue that has not been resolved at the level of the Council of Ministers.
- 8. Unless it decides otherwise, the Summit elects a Chairman, in turns, among the Heads of State and Government of the member countries following the alphabetical order of the name of the States in French, for a two-year tenn. In between two Sessions the Chainnan represents the Summit and takes decisions falling within his competence in the interest and for the smooth running ofthe Organisation.
